4. Practical immersion in Ministry

Breakout groups which were focused on a mark of mission will conduct a mission activity based on the mark

Proclaim the Good News	Prepare and record religious audio and video messages which will be broadcast through the region and shared on social media
Teach Baptise and Nurture	Engage with young adults from Grenada to develop a sample programme of activities for Discipleship in young adults
Respond to Human Need	Conduct a visit to provide day-services to Children and Elderly Homes (feeding, companionship, child/elderly care)
Transform unjust structures	Prepare and Record Advocacy Messages based on gender based violence and other social issues identified by the breakout group - these will be shared on social media
Safeguard Creation	Conservation Activity in collaboration with the Nature Conservancy

5. The Breakout groups on Marks on Mission:

Each Breakout group will focus on one Mark of Mission and consider the presentations, reports and reflections that relate to their particular mark.

Each Breakout group will prepare a report indicating:

- A. Comments on the documents received
- B. Reflections on what the church is currently doing with comment on activities that can be enhanced, revised, or discontinued
- C. Recommendations for the Church related to engaging youth regarding the mark
- D. Recommendations related to how youth can respond to the mark, broken down
 - Province
 - Diocese
 - Parish/ Archdeaconry/Deanery/Country
 - Individual Congregations
 - Families
 - Individuals
- E. Each Breakout group will begin with a bible study/reflection on the mark - presented by the convener

- F. Each Breakout group will spend the first working hour discussing the Marks that are not assigned to them (15 minutes per mark), prepare written suggestions on each mark, and send these to the Breakout group to which the mark is assigned.
- The Synod document will be used by all Breakout groups, reflecting on the relevant parts
